



The Next 50 Years of Historic Preservation, Powered by PechaKucha **Call for Student Research**

General Information

The University of Florida Historic Preservation Program is pleased to sponsor a student session at the annual Florida Trust for Historic Preservation (FTHP) conference in St. Petersburg, FL from May 18-20, 2017. This session is an opportunity for students to share their research with a professional audience in a conference setting. Building off of the theme of this past year's National Trust for Historic Preservation conference, presentations will focus on *The Next 50 Years of Historic Preservation*. Student research topics should reflect on the progression of the historic preservation profession since the enactment of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 and look forward to the next fifty years: What are the major threats to be addressed? How can preservation respond and adapt to changing environments? What recommendations can be made for improved approaches and practices? For consideration, students must submit an abstract of research along with the attached application. Copies of selected students' presentations and research papers will be provided to session attendees.

Presentation Format

For a fun, quick overview of their research, students will give a PechaKucha style presentation which is limited to 20 slides for 20 seconds each. See the following link for more information on PechaKucha and example presentations: [PechaKucha FAQ](#)

Eligibility Criteria

- Current full-time student in an undergraduate or graduate program. Enrollment in a historic preservation program is preferred, but students may have backgrounds in other related disciplines, such as planning, architecture, history, or archaeology.
- Research topics focused on historic preservation and conforming to the theme of *The Next 50 Years in Historic Preservation*.
- Research must be the work of an individual student, group research is not allowed. Each student may only submit one abstract.
- Registered as a conference attendee. Student registration is free of charge and may be completed at the [FTHP website](#).

Submission Requirements

- Attached application detailing contact information, school, program, and specialization/study focus
- Research topic title (may be draft) and explanation of relevance to historic preservation and session theme
- Abstract of research not to exceed 500 words
- *Optional*: A resume or curriculum vitae
